

## INTERVIEWS AND REMINISCENCES

In 1985 members of the BERKSWELL LOCAL HISTORY RESEARCH GROUP published volume 1 of the 'BERKSWELL MISCELLANY'. These members (called the 'OFFSHOOT GROUP') continued publishing further editions of the BERKSWELL MISCELLANY, finishing with volume 6 in 1990. Much of the contents of these volumes was obtained by the 'Offshoot Group' interviewing, in the nineteen eighties, long standing residents of Berkswell and the surrounding areas to obtain their memories of earlier life, friends, business and events.
